

Dramatic items must be announced with title and author at the time of performance to qualify for copyright indemnity and the performer must not change the words or gender of the characters.

In the event of a draw, the School with the most wins (over ALL four categories) will be appointed Champion. (If it is still a tie then the winners will be the School with the highest numbers of runners'-up in ALL four categories!).

There will be a prize for the best "Average Scored" Secondary School for Piping.

Points will be awarded to ALL entrants in all FIVE Piping categories (including the "Goose" competition) and an average taken from the total individual placings. The average individual scores will then be averaged again by the number of school entries to find the final average school score thus deciding the winner.

A minimum of TWO competitors from each school will be required to qualify for the "Best School" Award.

If there is a tie then the same procedures as set out for the Chanter competition will be applied.

The best overall Individual Piper will be awarded to the player with the most points in Classes 608 & 609. Players MUST play in both classes to qualify. Points will be awarded to ALL entrants in both classes and an average taken from the total individual placings. The average individual score will then be averaged again by the number of school entries to find the final average individual score - thus deciding the winner.

Should there be a tie, the piper with the higher MSR score will be the winner.
